Colorado State Spelling Bee Celebrates 76th Year

Top spellers from across state to compete on March 12 at University of Denver

Denver, CO - March 10, 2016 - More than 280 top student spellers from Colorado elementary and middle schools will gather at University of Denver's Sturm Hall on Saturday, March 12, 2016 to compete in the 76th Annual Colorado State Spelling Bee. The winner will advance to compete for a \$30,000 cash prize in the 2016 Scripps National Spelling Bee near Washington D.C. in May.

Over the 76 year history of Colorado students competing in the National Bee, a Colorado student has won the coveted national title seven times: 1957, 1959, 1979, 1980, 1982, 1989, and 2002. In 2015, Colorado State Spelling Bee champion, *Sylvie Lamontagne* from Creighton Middle School in Lakewood, made it to the top 10 in the national competition.

This spelling bee will include more than 280 pre-qualified 4th to 8th grade students from schools across the state. They will take part in written tests before advancing to the oral competition starting at 1 p.m. on Saturday, March 12. This exciting, free event is open to the public.

"We are proud to host and recognize the achievements of these incredible students from Colorado," said Carol Cline, Colorado State Spelling Bee event director. "They put so much time and dedication into studying for this competition and continue to impress us each year with their effort."
