## Colorado State Spelling Bee Celebrates 77th Year

# Top spellers from across state to compete on March 11 at University of Denver

Denver, CO - March 8, 2017 - More than 270 top student spellers from Colorado elementary and middle schools will gather at University of Denver's Sturm Hall on Saturday, March 11, 2017 to compete in the 77th Annual Colorado State Spelling Bee. The winner will advance to compete for a \$40,000 cash prize in the 2017 Scripps National Spelling Bee near Washington D.C. in May.

Over the 77 year history of Colorado students competing in the National Bee, a Colorado student has won the coveted national title seven times: 1957, 1959, 1979, 1980, 1982, 1989, and 2002. In 2016, Colorado State Spelling Bee champion, *Sylvie Lamontagne* from Lakewood, took 4th place in the national competition.

The Colorado State Spelling Bee will include more than 270 pre-qualified 4th to 8th grade students from schools across the state. They will take part in written tests to determine the finalists for the oral competition starting at 1 p.m. on Saturday, March 11. This exciting, free event is open to the public.

"We are proud to host and recognize the achievements of these incredible student spellers from across Colorado," said Carol Cline, Colorado State Spelling Bee event director. "They put so much time and dedication into studying for this competition and continue to impress everyone in attendance each year."
